## Visit from Paramananda Mission in India

The Organisation of Support for the Paramananda Mission's Orphanage in India (**SPM**), with postal address: **Terrassen 30, 8515 Narvik, Norway**, is an important support in the daily running of the orphanage in the Paramananda Mission, which depend on continuous monetary collections and donations for their existence. The year 2003 was the fourth year of operation for the organisation, and the number of regular contributors (sponsors) were 25 at the end of the year. The sponsors pay from NOK 75 to 500 a month, and all together NOK 66650 were received during the fourth year of operation.

The initiators and board members Hanne and Harald Harnang work for free, and no expences for postage or office are being charged the organisation. At the end of every year all regular contributions and collected means are collectively sent to India from bank to bank. A close and frequent contact with the orphanage secures that the money reaches its destination and is spent on the purpose it is meant for. The readers of The Mt.
