





Look - the University of Peace on Mt. Tron!





The University of Peace on the 'Peace Plateau'

In the future pilots will be able to view the Peace University on Mt. Tron in this way (see the picture above), except that the building fronts of course will be coated by stone and wood, and the roof with grass. In the picture above the construction is seen from south-east towards north-west. The part of the Mt. Tron Road which crosses the plateau is visible, together with the starting climb towards the top, far behind and on the right in the picture. The planned car parking and road into the construction, is not included in the picture but will be found to the south and east in the picture respectively. The altitude of the plateau is about 1300 metres and the summit is 1666 metres.

The intention of the Foundation is that the whole construction will be built according to ecological principles for energy and sanitary functions, i.e. that heating, light, ventilation, discharge, sewage systems, etc., will be based on the newest and most appropriate technology in accordance with an ecological way of thinking. The energy supply will for instance be based on several alternative sources and the construction will be self-contained and independent of supply from outside. It will be existing and 'breathing', and be self-regulating in all its 'most vital 'life-functions'', almost as a living organism. The Foundation will be working to make the University of Peace an interesting ecological pioneer project for constructions of this size and with such extreme climatic challenges.




