New home pages on the Internet

On Tuesday the 18th of March the Foundation's new home pages on the Internet were published. They can be viewed on the address: www.tronuni.org Altogether 12 pages + the opening page and a navigation page have been published, all in English. Above is seen the opening picture on the navigation page, with the logo of the University of Peace on Mt. Tron in the background. Around the logo are 12 small pictures which all represent the different pages, and by clicking them one comes directly to the respective page. Below the opening picture on the navigation page the same pictures are presented a bit bigger, with page title and a text which represents the very essence of all the text on the respective page. The pages have the following titles: **Idea; Prospect; Foundation; Project; Buildings; Model; Newsletter; Drawings; Site; Location; Activities** and **Inspirers**. So by viewing the navigation page (*Navigation Map*), one gets a good survey and a summary of all the home pages and the whole peace uni-

versity project on Mt. Tron. One comes to the navigation page by clicking "ENTER" on the opening page. All the pages, including the opening page, have a fixed left margin with a logo and links to all the pages, also the navigation page. By clicking the logo at the top one comes back to the opening page.

Not only the home pages are new, but also the logo (see more about this on the last page of The Mt. Tron Mail) and the drawings. Knud Larsen has revised the Pre-Project of 20.02.2002 and has added colours and digital effects, which considerably eases the understanding of the drawings. The new upgrade is now named Pre-Project 03.03.2003. And then The Mt. Tron Mail itself has got a new design where, as with the logo, all previous frames and fixed forms are removed, and more space released.

Mt. Tron University of Peace: *Location*

Mt. Tron is internationally known as the 'Mountain of Truth' or the 'Mountain of Wisdom' in Norway because the Indian sage, poet and philosopher, Swami Sri Anandaji, lived on the mountain for nearly 30 years. Both his tomb and his memorial are placed on this site.

On this page is shown Professor Kård Larsen's work model of the Mt. Tron University of Peace, from August 2001.

As this model was made at an early stage in the process, and before the completion of his Pre-Project of 20.02.2002, there are some differences from the drawings in the later Pre-Project, mainly concerning the tower and the great observatory, and the greenhouse.

The Mt. Tron University of Peace will work actively on two levels:

Here the display of four of the altogether 14 home pages on the Internet is shown, as they may appear on your PC screen. It is the pages **Project** uppermost, **Activities** at the bottom, **Location** in the middle behind, and **Model** in the middle in front. The pages are made in an dissolving of 800x600 pixles, so that they can be shown on most screens without the need of sideway scrolling. Here the screen is set on 1280x1024 pixles, which yield more space, and therefore a big, empty right margin in this display.

The new logo is beautifully and brilliantly designed by designer Birgitte Blandhoel, Oslo, for which the Foundation owe a debt of gratitude. It is a simplification of the former logo, which in 1993 was formed by the painter Glenn Pedersen, Oslo, after an idea by Bjørn Pettersen. After ten years of service it was required to form a new logo with a more simple and clear expression, liberated from the text around, and which would work as well in colours as in black and white. The logo depicts the very essence of the University of Peace:

The eye = "the mirror of the soul"; showing the human being as its main concern. The dove = "the messenger of peace"; showing its nature and mission.

Bird symbolism is universally spiritual and reflects the free spirit. Often birds are in the role as the combiner of "heaven and earth". The eye always reflects the essence of any human, and its form is most wonderful: The oval shape of the whole eye reflects the dynamic aspect of life, while the circular shape of the iris reflects the static aspect of life. Together they symbolize the Absolute Truth of Life.
